NORTHWEST TREK WILDLIFE PARK CLOSURES EARLY DUE TO SNOW

Eatonville, Wash. – Northwest Trek Wildlife Park closed early this afternoon due to snow and slick roads. The wildlife park was scheduled to be open until 3 p.m., but the snow and ice forced the closure about two hours early.

Northwest Trek is normally open from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Fridays through Sundays during the late fall and winter. The wildlife park will be open again on Friday.

Visitors who bring two or more items of shelf-stable food for the Emergency Food Network will receive half-off general admission each day the wildlife park is open through Nov. 19. The Help Out for Half-Off promotion benefits Pierce County families and individuals.

In addition, Friday, Saturday and Sunday are Veterans' Appreciation Days, and all those who are serving or have served honorably in the U.S. Armed Forces will be admitted at no charge Nov. 10, 11 and 12. Dependents will be admitted for half-off general admission. Proof of military service is required.
