WINTER WILDLAND IS A NOT-TO-BE-MOOSED EXPERIENCE AT NORTHWEST TREK WILDLIFE PARK, DEC. 26-27

Up to four kids 12 and younger get in free with each paying adult through Dec. 31, and visitors will see animals receive special winter-themed treats and enrichments this coming weekend



EATONVILLE, Wash. – It's been an amazing 40th birthday year at Northwest Trek, and it's about to get even more fun. There's no better way to celebrate the season with family and friends than viewing native Northwest animals cloaked in winter coats as they wander through their forested exhibit spaces or cavort in a wetlands area.

As a way of saying Thank You to visitors who have supported the wildlife park since 1975, we're offering a great deal for families this holiday season. Up to four kids, 12 and younger, get in free with each paying adult through Dec. 31.

And this coming weekend is an especially wonderful time to visit. It's Winter *Wildland* at Northwest Trek, a two-day event during which animals receive treats and other enrichments constructed of natural ingredients by their keepers.

Here's the schedule:

Saturday and Sunday, Dec. 26 and 27

11:30 a.m. Get up close as you watch animals enjoy their special holiday treats at the Presentation Stage.

1 p.m. See wolves explore their exhibit after keepers lay out holiday trees and wooden deer for them to investigate.

2 p.m. Watch critters in the wetlands area devour special treats made just for them.

Plus, every visit to Northwest Trek comes with a naturalist-narrated tour through the 435-acre Free Roaming Area aboard a heated tram.

The area is home to our 5-month-old moose calf, Willow, and three adult moose.

In addition, there are herds of American bison and Roosevelt elk, plus bighorn sheep, mountain goats, deer and other animals.

Beginning Dec. 26, Northwest Trek will be open from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. daily through Jan. 3 for kids and families enjoying Winter Break. The Kids Free promotion ends Dec. 31 and is not valid with any other discounts, coupons or passes.
