SHOW SEAHAWKS PRIDE AND SAVE ON ADMISSION AT NORTHWEST TREK WILDLIFE PARK

Wearing Seahawks' team spirit gear on Blue Fridays will get visitors \$3 off general admission

EATONVILLE, Wash. – It's a "touchdown" of another type for Seahawks fans.

Arriving at the Northwest Trek Wildlife Park ticket windows in any type of Seahawks gear - be it a shirt, hat, jacket, cap, scarf, beanie, shoes, socks, or a combination thereof - will score a discount of \$3 off general admission on Blue Fridays before Hawks' games this season.



Seahawks fans traditionally show their team spirit at work, school and in the community every Friday before a game.

That means this sweet Seahawks' spirit deal is available every Friday from now through Jan. 1 (except for Dec. 25 when the wildlife park will be closed.)

- Dec. 18
- Jan. 1

When the Seahawks get to post-season play (notice we said *when*, not *if*), Blue Friday discounts also will be in play on the Fridays before games. Those dates won't be available until the end of the year.
