CALLING ALL GIRL SCOUTS TO A NATURE-FILLED DAY AT NORTHWEST TREK WILDLIFE PARK ON SEPT. 23

Fun and badge-earning opportunities await on Super Girl Scout Day

Eatonville, Wash. – Members of Girl Scouts from Daisies through Cadettes will be able to learn about animals and nature while working on scouting badges at Super Girl Scout Day on Sept. 23 at Northwest Trek Wildlife Park.



Scouting activities begin at 11 a.m. and run until 4 p.m.

They will help Girl Scouts complete requirements for badges, depending on their age and scouting level. Scouts will be able to work on the following badges:

- **Daisies:** Use Resources Wisely
- **Brownies:** Hiker
- **Juniors:** Animal Habitats
- **Cadettes:** Trees

Scouts and/or troops are responsible for purchasing their own badges through the Girl Scout Council.

Scouts can also earn a special Northwest Trek patch.

Discounted tickets for Girl Scouts are available at www.nwtrek.org/events?cid=1385 for just \$10. Each scout may bring one adult guest at that price, but they must preregister on the website.

Discovery Tram tours are included with park admission, and tram times are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.

Visitors might see American bison, Roosevelt elk, bighorn sheep, moose, deer and other animals from the narrated tram tour of the 435-acre Free-Roaming Area. Elsewhere in the wildlife park, visitors walk paved pathways to

natural habitats that are home to black bears, wolves, foxes, bobcats, Canada lynx, river otters, beavers and other animals.
