NORTHWEST TREK WILDLIFE PARK OPEN SUNDAY; ADULTS HALF-PRICE DUE TO SNOW



EATONVILLE, Wash. – Northwest Trek Wildlife Park will be open on Sunday after this weekend's snowstorm.

However, trams will not be running in the Free Roaming Area due to icy roads.

All walking trails will be open, and adults will receive half-off general admission.

Up to four kids (age 12 and under) per adult will be admitted free as part of the Kids 'n' Critters discount weekend.

This weekend is a wonderful time to see woodland and wetland animals, their habitats turned into a winter wonderland by the snow. The Forest Café will be open with lunch, hot drinks and a cozy fireplace.

The wildlife park will be open 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. both Sunday Feb. 18 and also Monday Feb. 19 for President's Day.

Northwest Trek is normally open Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays during the winter.
